Over the past few years, Hong Kong Society of Professional Care (HKSPMC) has been actively exploring the way forward in different service areas and has made significant achievements in 2016. We have integrated our local care services, strengthened the promotion of first aid training, nursing education, enhanced medical cover services for the public and increased our international involvement.

Mission

The HKSPMC has been striving in promoting the health care knowledge in the community, improving the health care skills, training those who have the mission in caring for the vulnerable, sick and disable. HKSPMC aims at improving local health care quality through providing the diversified health care training programmes in Hong Kong. Our targets are the frontline health care professionals, those interested in taking up the health care jobs in the hospitals or old aged home, relatives or care-takers of the sick or the disabled as well as the general public.

a. In fulfilling the HKSPMC's mission in extending lifelong learning opportunities for the community, HKSPMC seeks to become a world-class centre of excellence for the provision of professional and continuing education serving Hong Kong, Mainland China and the region.

Setting up Youth and Volunteer Services Department

The Youth and Volunteer Services Department was formally set up on 1 January 2016. The new department has integrated the local care services scattered in different departments. Initially it would focus on elderly and sick

people. With the establishment of the new department, the other service departments have also realigned their service foci so as to achieve synergy and provide better services to the community.

General information of First Aid Training

HKSPMC has been keeping close communications with its first aid teaching volunteers and the service users to work out appropriate and diversified first aid training sessions that suits the public needs. During the year, we conducted 48 first aid training courses of 10 different kinds, totaling 3800 training hours. Out of 5,199 trainees, 5100 trainees (over 98%) passed and / or completed the training which also included 4005 trainees who successfully obtained the HKSAR government recognized first aid certificates with a passing rate of 98%.

Definitions (Part VI)

(b) a person trained in first aid shall be a person-

(iii) who has completed a training course in first aid and who holds a certificate to that effect issued by an organization approved by the Commissioner. AND

Hong Kong Society of Professional Medical Care (HKSPMC) is an organization approved by Commissioner of Labour Department, Hong Kong.

Overview

The Occupational First Aid Course provides training in CPR, basic first aid emergency skills. The goal of this training is to help students develop the knowledge, skills, and confidence to respond in a medical emergency. Occupational First Aid training programs use a proven seeing, hearing, speaking, feeling, and doing approach to make learning easier and more enjoyable. Varied ways of exposing the student to the information helps create better retention. As a result, students develop more confidence in their ability to respond to an actual emergency. Occupational First Aid training programs are divided into specific conceptual, skill or sequence segments. Each segment uses some combination of video, print, demonstration, and practice to present information to a student. Segments build on each other, reinforcing the core skills, and then gradually come together to show how those skills can be integrated into the overall care process. Two vital components of the instructional system are the program video and the small group practices. The required video uses short, scenario-based video pieces to relay essential cognitive information and to give students real-life demonstrations of skill technique and application. For hands-on practice,

students are arranged in small groups and take turns assuming the roles of first aid provider, patient, and coach. This multifaceted approach exposes students to the same information from different perspectives. Overall, the instructional system fosters more self-discovery on the part of the student. Instructors assume more of a facilitator role during class, spending less time talking or lecturing and spending most of the class time creating and maintaining an effective learning environment for students.

Automated External Defibrillation Course

With increasing availability and popularity in the use of Automated External Defibrillator, the HKSPMC launched the 'Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Course' for the general public to grasp the knowledge and skills of using the machine to save lives. A total of 742 trainees graduated during the year.

Milestones in First Aid Training

Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Training Course (緊急醫療應變人員訓練課程)

On 1 January 2016, HKSPMC advanced first aid course is being recognized by the Hong Kong Government included into the law of Chapter 509A as a formal training for the community. The advanced first aid award is named as Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) Certificate.

The Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) is an advanced first aid course to train qualified first aiders those have a duty to respond in an emergency and provide more skills and in-depth training beyond an ordinary first aider. This course is an entry-level medical course that trains candidates to respond to life-threatening medical conditions and traumatic emergencies. The course is systematically designed to progress learners through all aspects of pre-hospital care. As students' progress through the course, they will be introduced to essential concepts of medicine and first-aid while establishing a fundamental foundation in medical terminology, human anatomy, physiology. Specific assessments, medical protocols and interventions taught within the EMR curriculum. EMR training course certifies candidates as an Emergency Medical Responder meeting the national standard and exceeds the skills and knowledge of HKSPMC traditional occupational first aid courses. The duration of the course is 60 hours.

The Emergency Medical Responder course prepares the EMR student to provide prehospital assessment and care for patients of all ages with a variety of medical conditions and traumatic injuries. Areas of study include an introduction to emergency medical services systems, roles and responsibilities of EMRs, anatomy and physiology, medical emergencies, trauma, and special

considerations for working in the prehospital setting.

Health Care Training Courses

In the past year, the Institute organized different aged care and nursing care courses. In response to requests from the sector, HKSPMC also designed and held courses for aged care workers to enhance their professional knowledge and skills. As at 2016, HKSPMC had organized 78 courses with a total of 3,838 participants, 98% of whom were very satisfied with the course content, practicability and effectiveness. 2 newly developed courses are as follows:

1. Patient Care Assistant (Anaesthetic Assistant) Training Course
2. Certificate of Administering Injections and Immunizations Course

First Aid Services Team

Red Angel Medical Support Team,(RAMST) 紅衣天使急救醫療支援隊 established on 2005 as one of the teams of Adult Volunteer Group, aims at equipping a group of volunteers with various First Aid skills and serving the community by providing First Aid Services, in order to achieve our mission as “Give Heart, Save Life; Provide Emergency Care, Serve the Community”. In their basic training, RAMST members have to first refresh their knowledge and skills of first aid. Depending on their previous training, they may attend a refresher course in First Aid and a BLS-AED course (basic life support and external defibrillation). Then they are given the materials they need and familiarized with the medical equipment and procedures in their medical service sector. All members will also attend 60 hours further Emergency Medical Responder training courses each year. On these courses, they refresh their BLS-AED skills, while their knowledge of first aid, pre-hospital medical care and the manner of raising the alarm, are revised and strengthened.

In 2016, RAMST did 134 hours medical cover for the general public

organizations with different events and it is greatly appreciated by the organizers.



Future Plans

In the coming year, HKSPMC will continue to explore the training needs of the aged care and nursing care industries, with a view of finding and organizing more professional training courses. HKSPMC also plans to apply to the Hong

Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic & Vocational Qualifications for higher levels under the Quality Framework, and to organize accredited courses. Attempts will be made to strengthen the existing quality assurance mechanisms and measures, upgrade the teaching quality, and improve training facilities; teaching materials and assessment tools.
